This is riper but it remains agreeably fresh with its ever-so-slightly exotic aromas of dried yellow fruit, pear, citrus and floral hints. There is excellent volume to the overtly powerful and well-concentrated broad-shouldered flavors that possess a seductively textured mouth feel on the opulent finish that delivers very fine depth and length. Good juice built for the medium-term. (Outstanding)

Score: 87-89

A fresh, ripe and restrained nose offers up notes of ever-so- slightly exotic aromas of pear and white peach with limited Chablis character. There is good energy to the concentrated middle weight flavors that possess a lightly saline quality on the balanced finish. This forward effort should drink well young. (87- 89)/2016+
