Wines made from certified organically grown grapes avoid any synthetic pesticides or additives; whereas “organic” wines are made from organically grown grapes, and are also made without any added sulfites, except those that are naturally occurring. The majority of organic wines are either certified by regional organic entities or use the term “made with organically grown grapes” on labels.
