PROFILE

Founded in 1970 by Marc Colin and his wife Michele, Domaine Marc Colin now spans 15 hectares encompassing 26 appellations in Saint-Aubin, Chassagne, Puligny, and Santenay. Most of the land was inherited from past generations of the Colin and Ponavoy families; certain parcels have been in the family for more than 100 years. While the family does own prime territory in Chassagne, home base in Saint-Aubin features parcels of the very best vineyards, En Remilly and Chatenière, to name a few. Today Caroline and Damien, two children of Marc and Michele, own and run the domaine.

Vides Bourses is a small vineyard located just below the Grand Cru Bâtard-Montrachet. It is located along a little lane near a slight rise between Puligny and Chassagne. Here bandits would lay in wait for unsuspecting travelers and rob the unfortunate ones - so Vide-Bourses translates to “empty pockets.” This is a well-respected 1er cru that in good years can rival grand cru wines, but at a fraction of the price.
