The 2014 P'tite Grumotte, which comes from a selection from vines that are regularly affected by millerandage, and this is the first vintage where Laurent used a little whole bunch in the blend. It has a very vivacious, seductive bouquet with kirsch, blueberry and cassis fruit, beautifully defined with hints of violet that develop in the glass. The palate is medium-bodied with rounded tannin. There is some new oak (50%) to be subsumed, but there is already the harmony and depth here to suggest that it is a long term proposition. Gorgeous, opulent Marsannay for long term aging. Just 600 bottles only. - NM
